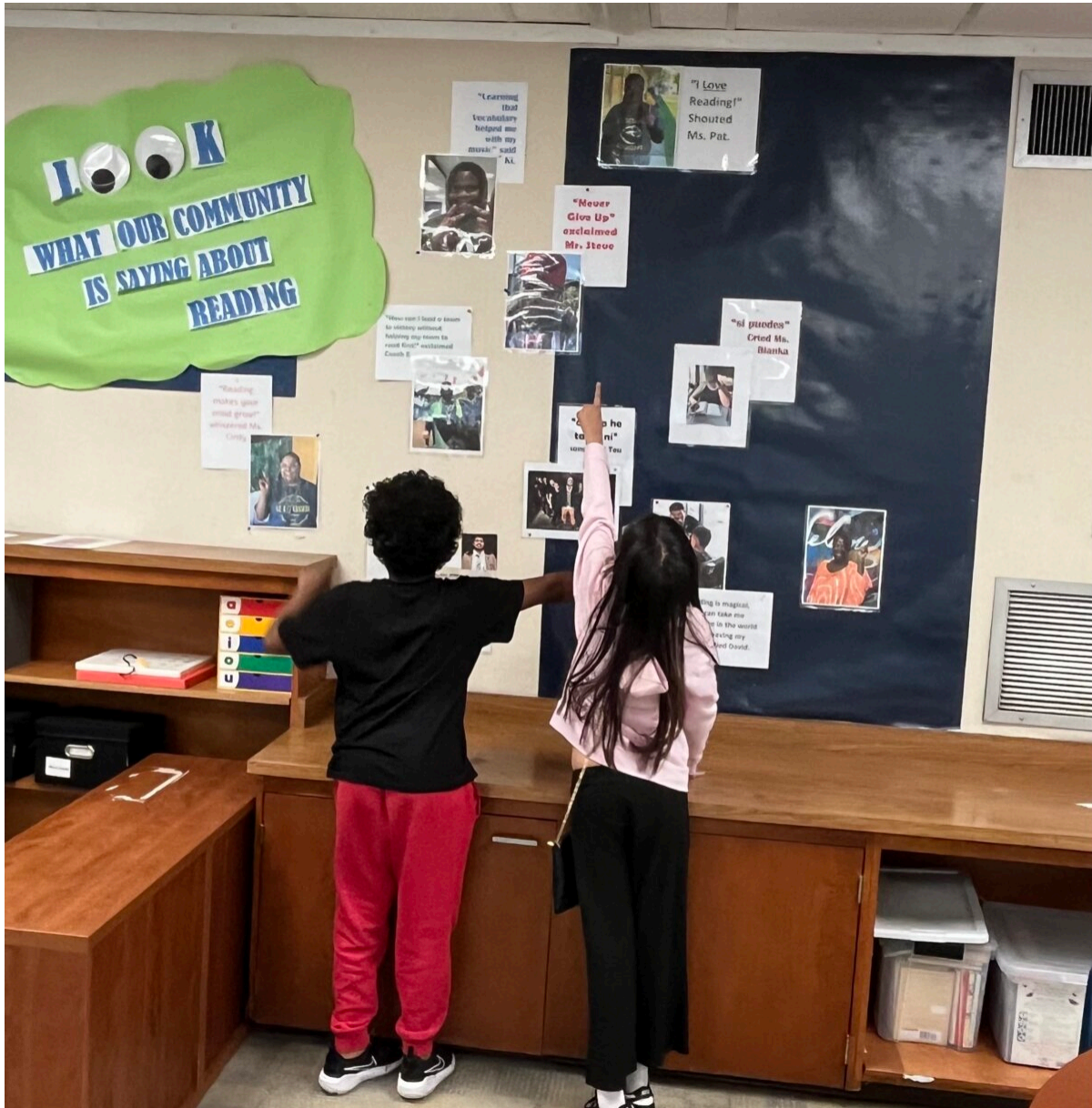




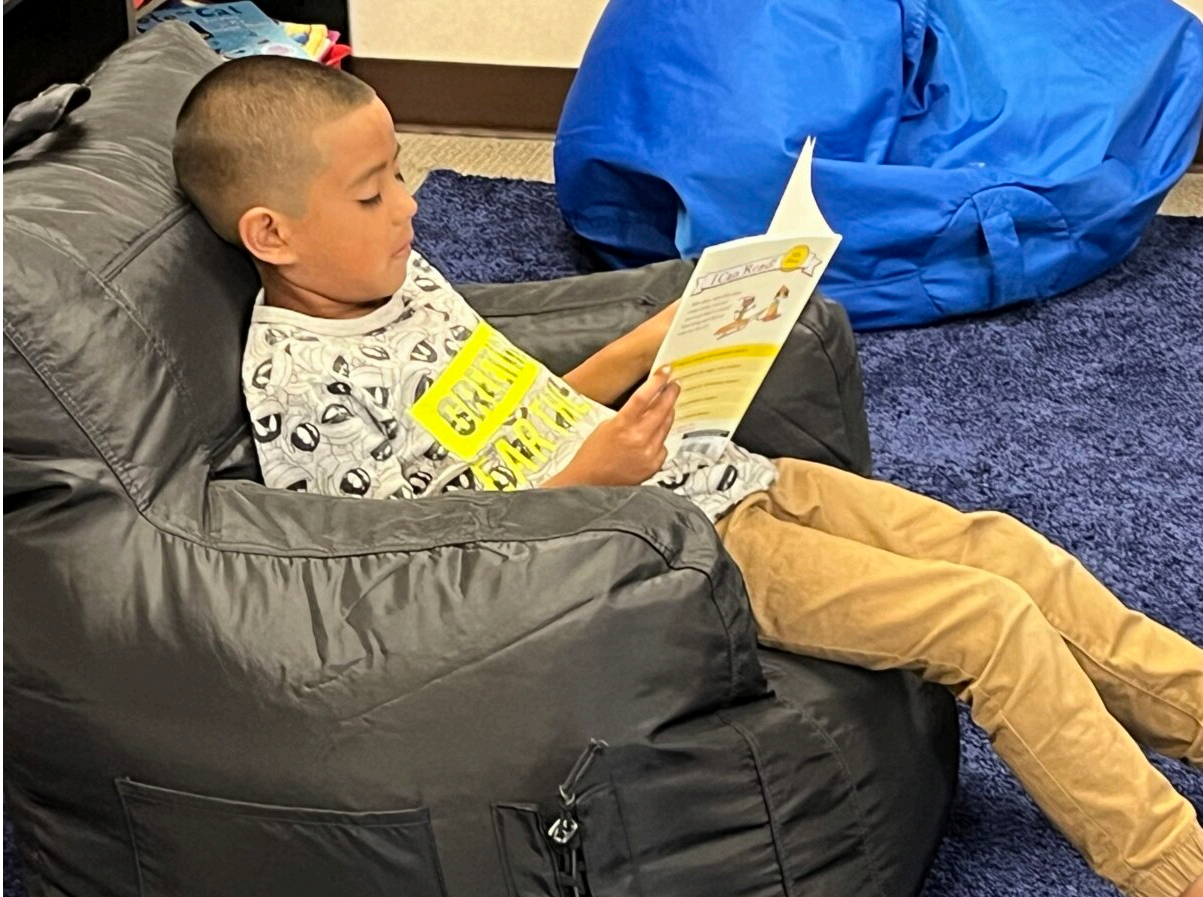
Concerns about reading scores? EPAK teachers are on it!
